“God’s people in a foreign land”

## Exodus chapter 1-

God preserves his people and will bring forth the promised Redeemer, no matter which human ruler tries to thwart God's plans.

## Historical Context:

- Joseph dies in Egypt at age 110
- The descendants of Joseph and his brothers flourish in the land of Goshen
- Timeline for Israelites entering Egypt is roughly 1800-1600 B.C.

# Periods of Egyptian History-

Great Pyramid of Giza built approx. 2650 B.C.

Middle Kingdom Period (2040-1782 B.C.)

2<sup>nd</sup> Intermediate Period (1782-1570 B.C.)

- Includes the Hyksos rulers

New Kingdom (1570 B.C.-1069 B.C.)

- What is the date of the Exodus?

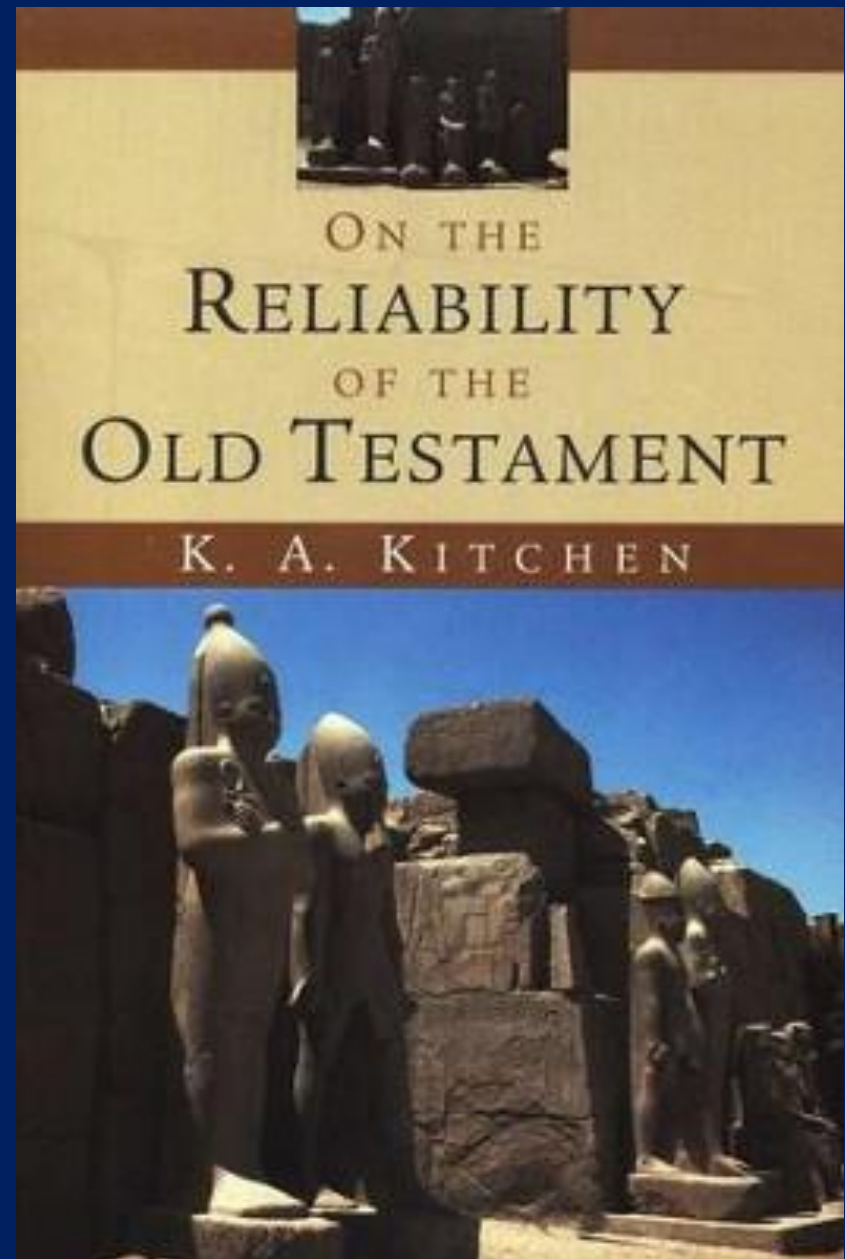
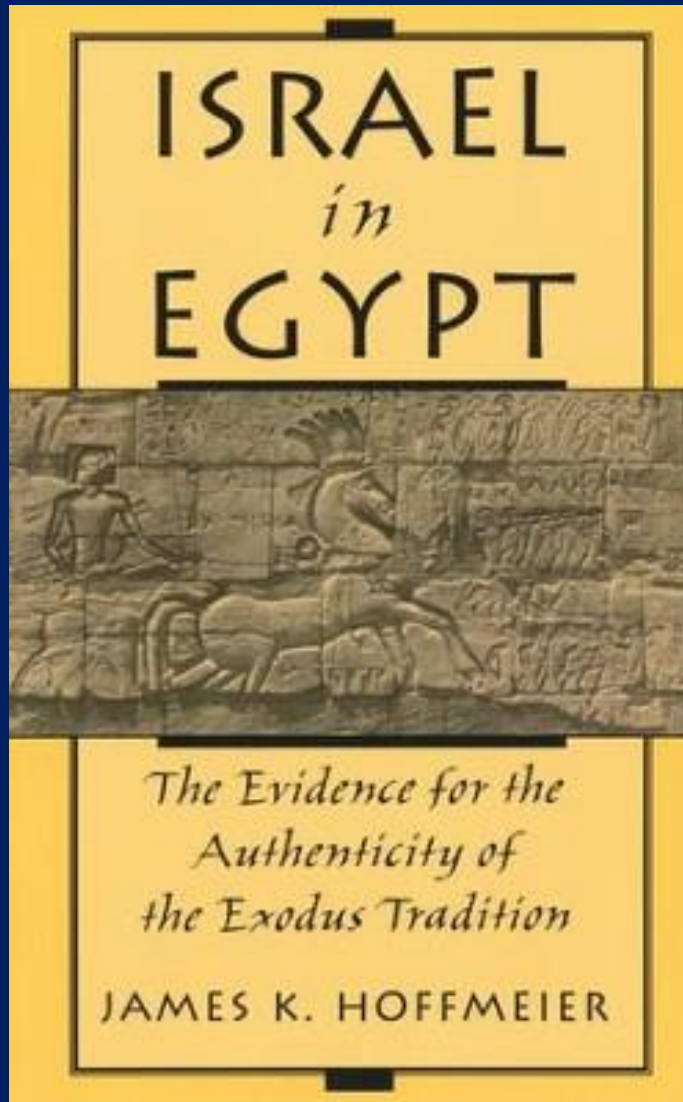
## Possible Dates of the Exodus-

Later Date- 1260 B.C.- during the reign of Ramses II

Earlier Date- 1446 B.C.- during the reign of Thutmose III, whose son, Amenemhat, died between 1455-1444 B.C.
