Main Point-

People will either worship themselves or something else as king

OR

They will bow down and worship Jesus.

Implication- those in the Kingdom of God receive truth with pleasure.

John 18:33-35

So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?" Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered you over to me. What have you done?"

1st Truth-

Jesus asks—and He ultimately knows—where your heart is in relationship to him as your King.

2nd Truth-

The kingdom of man is achieved by physical force. But Christ's kingdom grows by the Spirit moving in the hearts of men and women

John 3:3

Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

John 3:6

That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
